HODGE, WILLIAM - Came to Texas in December, 1825. This is stated in Headright Certificate No. 122 for one-third of a league of land issued to him in 1838 by the Board of Land Commissioners for Fort Bend County.

Harrisburg

HODGE, WILLIAM - Name appears on an army roll at the General Land Office as a member of Captain Payton R. Splane's Company among those detailed to guard the baggage at the camp opposite Harrisburg April 21, 1836. In a Comptroller's Military Service Record Captain Splane, at Goliad June 5, 1836 certified that Mr. Hodge had served in his company from March 6 to June 5, 1836.

On August 22, 1845 Adjutant General William G. Cooke issued to Mr. Hodge Donation Certificate No. 1207 for 640 acres of land for "having participated in the battle of San Jacinto (detailed as Baggage Guard)".

The marriage records of Washington County show that Mr. Hodge was married to Miss E. Mitchell, December 19, 1847.

Mr. Hodge was living in Falls County, December 20, 1851 when he sold his donation certificate.
