

PECK, NATHANIEL - In applying for land in Robertson's Colony January 19, 1836, Mr. Peck stated that he was born in New York in 1818. In the Headright Certificate issued to him by the Fort Bend County Board in 1838 it is stated that he came to Texas in January, 1836.

Mr. Peck was issued Bounty Certificate No. 3195 for 640 acres of land for having served in the army from March 12 to September 25, 1836. He was fourth sergeant of Captain William Wood's Company at San Jacinto and on December 1, 1838 was issued Donation Certificate No. 645 for 640 acres of land for having participated in the battle.

Mr. Peck was married to Elizabeth Goodman at Houston August 31, 1837, as is disclosed in the marriage Records of Harris County. They were living in Fort Bend County in 1844. The Probate Records in Fort Bend County show that Mr. and Mrs. Peck were living in San S Joaquin, California, August 26, 1867 when they appointed Marmaduke Goodman as their agent to dispose of their land in Texas.
