

BUCKLER, HENRY - The compiler is responsible for having Mr. Buckler's name put on the bronze plaque in the San Jacinto memorial museum as one of those who was detailed to guard the baggage at the camp opposite Harrisburg April 21, 1836. Sufficient evidence has not been obtained to justify the claim that he performed the service mentioned.

In Headright Certificate No. 574 for two-thirds of a league and one labor of land issued to him in 1838 by the Board of Land Commissioners for Red River county it is simply stated that he had arrived in Texas prior to March 2, 1836. He had previously, before marrying, received a headright certificate for one-third of a league from the Red River county Board.

Mr. Buckler is listed on page 232 of the army rolls in the General Land Office as having served in Captain William H. Patton's company after the battle of San Jacinto. He was issued Bounty Certificate No. 1302 for 1280 acres of land June 8, 1853 for having served in the army from May 8, 1836 to May 8, 1837.
