BUFORD, THOMAS YOUNG -- Born in South Carolina, August 5, 1814. In Headright Certificate Mo. 384 issued to him March 3, 1838 for one League and one Labor of land by the Nacogdoches County Board of Land Commissioners it is stated that he came to Texas provious to May 2, 1835. In the cortificate of character issued to him June 2, 1835 by Juan Hugenio Miechanpa, Alealde pro tem, it is stated that Mr. Buford w was at that time single but it aoes not say in it when he came to Texas. That he arrived in April, 1835, is shown in the proceedings of the Nacogdoches County Board of Land Commissioners in Dooket No. 470, Thomas Y. Buford, in which Thos. J. Rusk and Adolphus Sterne testified that each of them had "known hin since Arpil, 1835, married since Declaration of Independence, perforraed services in theArmy."

Mr. Buford was a rember of Company J, Cavalry, commanded by Gaptain Willism H. Smith at San Jacinto, and on April 23, 1847. his estate received Donation Certificate No. 72 for 640 acres of land due him for having participated in the battle. In Comptroller's Military Service Record No. 4318 it is certipied that he served in the army from March 27 to September 27, 1836. He was promoted to First Lieutenant and put on detached gervice June 10th and sent to Nacogdoches to recrui\% for the army.

After the Battle of San Jacinto Mr. Buford was married to Mary B. Simpson, daughter of John J. and Jane 用, Simpson, a well-to-do and prominent family of early Hecogdoches. Her brothers and sisters were: William M. Simpson, who married Mrs. Letitia Buford; Jane Caroline Simpson, who married A. A. Nelson; Victor J. Bimpson, who first
married Harriet Arnold and later Namie E. Gilkerson; Fannie A. Simpson, who married Condy Raquet; S. Mmiy Simpson, who married John S. Griffith; Florence R. Simpson, who married a Mr. Edwards; Augustus J. Simpson, who married firma J. Kyle, and Isaac J. Simpson.

Mr. Buford aled on his faum near Nacogdoches August 23, 1839, survived by his widow and two infanft daughters, Mary T. and Susan Jane Buford. William B. Buiord afterwards married the widow of Thonas Y. Busord and reared both of the daughters to womanhood.
