GREEN, GRORGE - Born in Harve de Grace, Maryland, Hay 18, 1813, a son of Joshua Green and Hlizabeth (Kentle Myer) Green. Joshua Green was born on Bush River, Harford County, Maryland, about 1762 and died. at Harve de Grace September 20, 1840. He was Harried October 27, 1805 to Hizaboth Kentle Myer, who was born in 1785 and died at Harve de Grace September 28, 1861. Their children were John, Henry, Joshua, Thomas, George, Littleton, Louisu, Harriett and Elizabeth Green.

Goosge Oreen, the subject of this sketch, always clained that he swam to Texas. The boat that he sailed in was totally wrecked by a storm in the Gulf of Hexico and he was forced toswim a mile to reach Velasco. In the Headright Certificate issued to hin Debruary 4 , 1838 for onemthird of a League of Land by the Milam County Board he certifies that he arrived in Texas May 4, 1835. On May 8, 1838 he received Bounty Certificate No. 3228 for 640 acres of land for his services in the axny from ${ }^{M_{a}}{ }_{c h} 20$ to October 3, 1836. He was a member of Gaptain Jease Billingsley's Company at San Jacinto and on November 19,1840 , was issued Donation Certiricate No. 1085 for 640 acres of land for having partieipated in the battle. He was dismissec from Gaptain Billingsley"s company June 20th, and then enlisted in Gaptain William W. Hill's company of rangers. The Veterans Papers at the University of Texas contain an affidavit by Mr, Ureen in whine he states that in the surmer of 1836 he served three months in Captain H$H 11$ s coxpany. Hie also stated that he served under Gaptain Winliam M. Eastiand in the campaign against Indians in 1837 and undar Gowonel Eawin Hoorehouse in 1842. Shortiy after the battle of San

Jacinto Mre, Green settied at Nashvil2e, Milam County, living for a nurbers of years in the home of John W. Porter, surveyor for Roberte son's Colony. He became deputy surveyor, first under James Howlet and then under George B. Krath, a comrade of San Jacinto. Krath ard Green surveyed the original Milam Land District and most of the land in the district. They laid out thetown of Waco and Cameron. While on a surveying trip, they stopped for dinner one day and found that the sun was exactly on the meridian. They named the place Meridian and it later became the county seat of Bosque County.

In 2840 Mtr. Green was married and moved to Chancet a Prairie, then in 進lam County but now in Burleson Gounty. In 2847 he moved to Caperon. He was twice rarried, the first time in 1840 to Martha Chance, daughter of James and Sarah Ann Harrell Chanee, Mrs. Green was born Noveriber 11, 1822 near Raymond, Hines County, Masissippi, and aled May 18, 1859at Gameron, Texas.

Children of this marringe were Louist, who married willian Bartlett Streetran; Ben iklam, who was killed at Qettysburg; Robert Baylor, who marmied Idella Edwarda; Charles, who married Sallie Furguson; Budocia, who mamied John Louis Smith; James Buchanan, who maxriea Adaline Posey, and Muniee Oreen, who died young.

Mr. Green was maxried April 1, 1861 to Nancy Hasseltine Anderson, daughter of Rev. Thomas Haddison and Hary Ounningham Anderson. Mrs. Grean was born in Talladega, Alabanta, June 9, 1840 and died at Caneron, Toxas December 23, 2918. Wr. Green died April 19, 2885 and he and his wives are buxied in marked graves in Oakchill canetery, Ganteron,

Milam County, Texas. Mr. Green was a member of the Texas Veterans Association, a liason, and belonged to the liethodist Churoh.
