GUSTINE, DR. LBMUE - The nare appears of the San Jacinto rolls printed in a booklet in 1836 as Lem Gustine. (M,D.), a maraber of Captain Henry W. Karnes! Cavalry Congany. On page 29 axray rolls in the General Lend Oifice the name is listed as Lem Gustun, M. D. Sometime after the bettle of San Jacinto Dr. Gustine was transferred to Gaptain William H. Patton's Company. On page 232 of the army rolls is a "Return irom the Muster Roll of the Columbia Company attached to the 2nd Regiment of the Texas Ammy in 1836, said Company being comanded by Captain William F. Patton, and comprising a list of the men in it, who were engaged in the battle of San Jacinto on the 21st April A. D. 1836." The roll was compiled by Colonel Jesse Benton, Jr., and was sworn to at his home in San Augustine June 21, 1856. It was sent to the Land OPfice by Governor B. M. Pease on September 10, 1856. The roll contains a total of 122 names arranged in numbericel order. Dr. Lem1. Gustine of Natchez is No. 60 and following his name is the notation: "Attended on Genl. Houston, after he was wounded". The roll is endorsed on the back by Colonel Benton as follows:

NNote: The principal pert of the men on pages Nos. 1 and 2, up to No. 63, and some others were mostly discharged about June 15, 1836, by Captain Patton and General Rusk. The renainder was aischarged by myself and the Col. of the Regiment. They served out their time in the army and in the fall of 1836 I discharged the last man, and returned home to my family. About the 5th of August Captn. Patton, ordered by the General, took ten men of the company and proceeded to

Columbia on Brazos to take charge of President Santa Anna, wich he did. ${ }^{n}$

Dr. Gustine ame from a family of doctors. A tombstone standing in the old ceraetery in Natchez, il ssissippi bears inscriptions for four brothers buried nearby. On the south face: "Dr. Samue). Gustine, M. D., Born in Cariisle, Pennsylvania, October 19, 1783; Died July 6, 1845." On the east face: "James Gustine, M. D. Bory in Garlisle, PennsyIvania, January 27, 1786; Died Oct. 1, 1814." On the north face: "Lenuel Parker, M. D. May 9, 1794; died Oetober 3, 1833."

Dr. Lemuel Gustine, subject of this sketch, was born in Gariisle, Pennsylvania in 1816, a son of Dr. James Gustine who moved to Natchez, Mississippi in 1817. He came to Texas in Jenuary, 1836 and was a member of Gaptain Henry W. Kapnes! Cavalry Gompany at San Jacinto. He evidently roturned home shortly after receiving his aischarge and the land opfice records do not disclose that he applied for the headright bounty and donation lands âue him. He was twice marriec. His first wife was Jane MeCreary. By this marriage there was but one child, James, who died at the age of eighteen years. Next he was maxried to Sophia Thompson ana thelr chilaren were Richard, Mary, Lemel, Stephen Duncan, Samuel, Blla Sophia and Sarah Blanc Oustine. Dr. Gustine aied in New Orleans May 22, 1852. The date of the death of his widow has not been ascertained. Their place of burial is not known. No information has been received concerning their fir st child, Richard.

Hary Gustine was maxried to Captain Robert Buckner. Mrs. Buckner
died in 1864. Their only child, Mary, was married to Dr. J. W. Allen of Shreveport, Louisians.

Lenuel Custine 11 was married to Mary Ann Walters. Mo. Gustine died in 1901. Kis children were (1) Saddee, who died in 1911; (2) Lemuel, who lives in Shreveport; (3) Harry, who lives at 2126 Sunset Boulevard, Houston; (4) Richard, who married Ilizabeth Dess and lives in Shreveport.

Stephen Duncen Gustine was married in 1863 to Marie Louise Barnett. Their children were Carrie Belle, Lou $\mathbb{I L l a}$, Daisy Inez, wwo married Alfred Lionel Greenwood and reaides at Bayou Goula, Louisiana; Stephen Drencan II and Wrnest Gustine.

Samuel Gustine was married in 1880 to Carrie Olaric. Mr. Gustine died at Colorado, Mitchell County, Texas.

111a Sophia Gustine was married in 1874 to 滥. B. Hamilton. Their daughter, Mary Virginia, was married to Dr. J. W. Allen.

Sarah Blanc Gustine was married to Mr. Buckner of New Orleans.
Much information regarding the fanily of Dr. Gustine was furnished by Mrs. Marion Gustine Allgeyer, 1137 Nashvilie Avenue, New Orleans, daughter of Dr. F. J. Gustine, noted eye specialist and inventor, Dr. Lemuel Gustine was a first cousin to Dr. Prederick Wlliam Gustine, the Pirst eye specialist in the south. Dr. Mrederick W. Qustine was the father of Dr. T. J6 Gustine. Other infomation was supplied by Mrs. Olifford Weaver of HeKinney, Texas, author of the "Gustine Compendum ${ }^{n}$.
