IOUGHRIDGE, WILLTAM WALLACE - Born in Laurens, South Carolina, November 21, 1816, the sixth child of James and Deborah Ann (MoGil1) Loughridge. The eleven other ohildren in order of birth were Allen Eccles, Robert MeGill, John, Elizabeth, James Franklin, Andrew Kackson, Thomas Lewers, James Rodgers, Samuel Gray and Maria Jane, and Joseph Loughridge.
$M_{r}$. Simon $P_{0}$ Ford who served with Mr. Loughridge in Captain William Wood's Company at San Jacinto made an affidavit September 3, 1836 that he, William Loughridge of Greene County, Alabama, Baward Miles and others had arrived at Matagorda, Texas, January 10, 1836 , as amembers of Captain C. V. Vickery's Company.

Donation Certificate No, 1015 was issued to the heris of Mr. Loughridge February 4 , 1840 for 640 acres of land due Mr. Loughridge for having particioated in the battle of San Jacinto. phis was in compliance with a joint resolution of Congress approved February 3, 1840 requiring the Secretary of $W_{a r}$ to insue to the legal representaw tives of William Loughridge, deceased, a certificate for donation land for services in the battle of San Jacinto. Bounty Cartificates for services in the arry, if issued, are not of record in the General Land opfice. His headmight cortificate was issued to Robort Henry, Admine istrator of his estate, $D_{e}$ cember 30, 1839. Mr. Henry was appointed Administeator in wobertson County, July 29, 2839.

Mr. Loughridge was never married. His nophew Mr. Jaokson B. Loughridge, Johnson City, nephew of William W. Loughridge, wrote to the compile that his uncle died near Wheelock, Robartson County, but
in Brazos County，January 24，1838．His grave is lost．
Colonel James R．Louchridge，brother of William W．Loughridge， was born in Laurens，South Carolina，November 12， 1821 and died in Navarro Oounty，Texas，November 10，1886．He was narried to ${ }^{10}$ ary Felicia Martin who was born at Gorn Ridge，Arkansas and died at Corsicana，Texas

Mr. Wm. W. Loughriage came to Texas in January 1836 as a member of Captain $C_{0}$ W. Vickery's Company but served in Captain Willtum Woods Co, at $S_{a n}$ Jacinto, Aecording to Mr. J. B. Loughridge son of Colonel J. R. Lou hridge, Mr. Wm W. Loughridge died about twenty (20) miles south of Wheelock Texas. Jan. 24, 1838. The place at that time was called Brazos.

Donation Certificate No. 1015 was issued to the heirs of $\mathrm{H}_{\mathrm{l}}$. Loughridge Feb, 4, 1840 for 640 acres of land due $M_{r}$. Loughridge for having participated in the battle of San Jacinto. This was in Compliance witha joint resolution of Congress approved Teb. 3, 1840 requiring the secretary of war to issue to the legal representatives of Willian Loughridge deceased, a certificate for domation land for services int he battle of San Jacinto.

Bounty Certificates for services in the army if issued, are not of record in the General hand office.

His Headright Cortificate was issued to Robert Henry, Administrator of his estate, Dec. 30, 1839. He. Henry was appointed administrator in Robertson County July 29, 1839 Joseph Johnson was appointed administrator in Washington County April 30, 1838.

James Loughriage (Father of Wm. W Loughridge) was born at Duna-
gans Hill Antrim Co. Ireland Aug. 15, 1783 married Deborah Ann MoGill in S. C. U. S. A. 1806 Father and Mother (IF1izaboth Gray) of Deborah Ann were from Antrin County Families in Ireland.

James Loughridge, died at the home of He. John Box in ${ }^{H}$ acogdoches Gounty Texas. July 9, 1838. While on a trip to Texas in an effort to reach the bedside of his wounded son William.

James was the son of Allen Loughridge born probably about 1757 who married Sarah Eceles 1ived at Antrim Co. Iraland.

This Loughridge line is said to be carried backward by a book of geneology from Allen Loughridge to a King of $I_{\text {reland who reigned }}$ over the "Mmerald Isle" before Chriatianity was introduced there.

The Compiler of this has never seen a copy of the book.
