MERCER, KLI - Born in Georgia June 28, 1790. He was a brother of the celebrated Jesse Midrcer. He was married to Anna Thompson and to them were born the following childron: Penelope, December 10, 1811; Reason, October 17, 1813; Levi, July 28, 1815; Rlijah Go, Harch 20, 1819; Teressa, February 21, 1822; and Lettelia, December 1, 1827.

Mr. Mercer and his family moved to Amite County, Mississippi, and located on Pearl River, There on September 28, 1828, his daughter Penelope was married to Cail Borden, Jro, who in later years Invented a process for condensing milk (Mrs, Borden died in Galveston Setpember 5, 1844). Nor. Borden had moved to Mississippi from Indiana in 1825.

In the year 1829 Mr . Mepeer and Pamily and Gail Bordens Jro, and wife came to Texas and settled in Egypt in the present county of Wharton, where Gail Borden Sr.e, and some of his sons had located a Pew years before. Mr. Mercer received title to a league of land in Austin's Thira Colony December 13, 1830, situated in the present county of Jackson. On March 15, 1838 he recelved a Headright Certificate $N o .112$ for a labor of land from the Colorado County Board of Land Comissioners, Beype at that time being in Colorado County. In the aertipicate it is simply stated that he arrived in Texas before May 2, 1835.

Mr. Mercer was one of the delegates to the Pirst Convention of Texas which convened at San Felipe de Austin October 1, 2832, from hte district of Mina (not to be confused with the Mina - Bastrop - Munici-
pality later created). He was also a delegate to the Second Convention of Texas hold in San Felipe in 1833. At Son Jacinto he was Orderly Sergeant in Captain William J. E. Heard's Company of "Oitizen Soldiers" and on November 20,1838 he was issued Lonation Certificate No, 613 for 640 acres of land for having participated in the battle and Bounty Gertificate No. 4432 for 320 acres of land for having served in the army from February 29 to May 30, 1836.

Mr. Mercer was one of the charter trustees of Baylor University, Independence, incorporated Pebruary $1,1845$.

Mrs. Mercer, bom December 22, 1796, died at TEype, Tezas, January 8, 1855. ilr. Mercer, according to Probate Records of Colorado County, Book $D_{9}$ page 160, died at Hgype, December 7f 2872.

Mrs.J. J. Hing, 2220 Windsor Place, Fort Worth, wrote to the compiler as follows, Mareh 17, 1938:
${ }^{\text {nAt }}$ Webberville we had a talk with Mr. Lee Manor (since deceased) and he told us about the old Manor and Woods cemetery on top of the hill above where the Blake Manor store and old home is. He said: 0 old Father Mercer is buried up there and I an the only one who knows where his grave is. I guess it is on our lot and my father showed it to me! We found at the foot of the grave where Mrg, Taulman is standing in the Kodak picture I am sending you "E. $M_{0}$ " on a piece of slab. Beside the grave is one under atree With nothing readable on the bits of stones that must be the marking of his wifels gravo."
