MOSIER, ADAM -- Came to Texas in 1835, although it is stated that he arrived in 1836 in Headright Certificate No. 258 for one-third of a league of land issued to him February 3, 1838 by the Board of Land Commissioners for Matagorda County. On page 24 of the army rolls in the General Land Office he is shown as a member of Captain William Cooke's Company of New Orleans Greys, and is shown as having been born in Kentucky. The Greys arrived at Velasco, October 25, 1835.

On November 10, 1845 Mr. Mosier was assued Donation Certificate No. 1217 for 640 acres of land for having participated in the Storming and Capture of Bexar, December 5 to 10, 1835. In Comptroller's Military Service Record No. 3365 it is certified that he served in the army from April 1 to May 10, 1836. He was a member of Captain William S. Fisher's Company at San Jacinto.

Mr. Mosier enlisted for the Somervell Expedition as a member of Company A, Captain Ewen Cameron. He was releaved from prison in Mexico, September 16, 1844.

On August 11, 1846 Mr. Mosier was living in Galveston County, when he sold his headright land which had been surveyd in Gonzales County. (Book F, page 263, Deed Records of Gonzales County.)
