SECREST, FIELDLWO - On page 228 of the "Lost (Hoadright) Book" of Harris County in the Spanish Aarhives in the General Land orfice it is stated that Hr. Secrest came to Texas in 1835. Early in the year 1835 Mr. Seorest as a singlo man was issued Headright Cortificate No. 341 for onemthled of a league of land by the Board of Land Cormissioners of Brazoria County. He was married September 25, 2838 and aftewwards he recesved a headright cortificate for two-thirds of a League and one labor of land by the Herri burg Gounty Board. In this certipicate it is stated that he came to Texas prior to May 2, 1835. This was lost and a duplicate was i sued August. 140 . 1852.

HP. Secrest was a member of $0_{\mathrm{aptain}}$ Henry W. Karnes" $\mathrm{C}_{\text {ompany }}$ and his San Jacinto Doriation Certificate No. 464 for 640 aeres of land was iseued to his heirs December 18, 2852. His Bounty Certipieate for services immodiately prior to and after the battle of San Jacinto are not of recora in the Land 0pfice. He was issued Bounty Certificate No. 2723 for 320 acres of land for having sevved in the arny from June 25 to December 25, 1836. He enlisted in the Washington Cavalry, comanded by washington $\mathrm{H}_{\text {. }}$. Seorest June 25, 1836.

The Harriage Records of Harrisburg Gounty show that Me. Seorest and 14 zat $H_{0}$ Sneed were married at Houston Septerber 25, 1838. Miss Sneed was a daughter of John $H_{0}$ Sneed and had two sisters, Mrs. Sallie W. Woodward and Mrs. Susan Shetidan. Mrs. Secrest died in Houston in 1839, Leaving her husband and in infant daughter, Hilzabeth Eo, who died two months lates.

Mtro Secrest was a brother of Washington Ho, Jacob, Thomas Ge,
 a. Mr. Magnoss and Sarah maxriod a Mr. Hogan.

The Probate Records of Hamis Gounty, Book $S$, page 226 , show that Mr. Mielding Searost died in Fouston, Juns 1, 2840. Wontained in the record are the names of the brothers and sisters of Mr. Secrest and the information regarding the abath of hro. Searest.

A duplicate Headright Cortificate for twombirds of a league and one labor of land was iscued lay 14,1852 , to Thomas $C$. and Felix $A$. Secrest of Cuadalupe County, heirs of wr. Secrest. Hr. Sneed. father of Hus. Secrest, died in 1852.
