Highlights of the event include living history camps, craft demonstrations and vendors reflecting Texas in the 19th Century. There are musicians, entertainers, arts and crafts for children, and – of course – the largest battle reenactment in the state. As a volunteer, you will learn how Texas won its independence, meet new people, give back to the community, and have fun!

- Offering directions and assistance at Shuttle Bus pick-up/drop-off points

Please arrive approximately one hour earlier than your assigned time. You will park in the designated area for volunteers and take the golf cart shuttle service to the Festival site. REGISTER AT THE VOLUNTEER CHECK-IN BOOTH, where you will receive your instructions and a ticket for a FREE lunch.

The San Jacinto Battleground State Historic Site is located 19 miles east of downtown Houston. Take Beltway 8 or Loop 610 to Hwy. 225 East (Texas Independence Highway). Exit at Independence Parkway and travel north. On Festival day, you will be directed to special parking areas.
