BREEDING, FIDELIE S. - Son of David Breeding, who was a member of the Board of Land Commissioners for Fayette County in 1838. John Breeding, probably a relative of Fidelie S. Breeding, was the first sheriff of Fayette County. In the headright certificate issued to Fidelie S. Breeding January 19, 1838 for one-third of a league of land by the Fayette County Board it is stated that he had arrived in Texas in February, 1833. He was a member of Captain William J. E. Heard's Company of Citizen Soldiers at San Jacinto and on January 29, 1839 was issued Donation Certificate No. 778 for 640 acres of land for having participated in the battle. He did not apply for land due him for other services in the army.

In the Deed Records of Fayette County, Book A, page 48, it is stated that Mr. Breeding's home, March 15, 1849 was in Fayette County.
