PACE, WESLEY WALKER -- Born in Virginia and came to Texas in 1828.

This is shown in the sketch of his brother, James Robert Pace. He was issued Bounty Certificate No. 4330 for 320 acres of land for serving in the army from March 18 to June 18, 1836. He was a member of Captain William 5. Fisher's Company at San Jacinto and on September 24,

1838 was issued Donation Certificiate No. 552 for 640 acres of land for having participated in the battle. In the headright certificate issued to him May 17, 1838 for one-third of a league of land by the Board of Land Commissioners of Brazoria County it is stated that he arrived in Texas prior to May 2, 1835 (?).

Mr. Pace died in Galveston in 1839. This is shown in the Probate Minutes of Galveston County, Book B, page 19. John E. Sellers was appointed administrator of his estate November 25, 1839. The heirs of Mr. Pace were James R. Pace of Travis County, Dempsey Pace and Mrs. Martha Jane Pace Brown of Colorado County.
