PRUITT, MARTIN -- Name not shown on San Jacinto relis printed in 1836. In Comptroller's Military Service Record No. 7425 signed by Captain Hayden Arnold, it is certified that Mr. Pruitt served in Captain Arnold's Company from March 7 to July 7, 1836, and participated in the Battle of San Jacinto. He was issued Bonation Certificate No. 212, June 26, 1850, for 640 acres of land for having been in the battle. He was living in Limestone County, July 6, 1850 when he sold the certificate to Jesse Duren for \$100.00. Mr. Pruitt did not receive a headright from the Republic of Texas. He came to Texas with his brother, Levi Pruitt and in the headright certificate issued to hevi Pruitt in 1838 for a league and labor of land from the Board of Land Commissioners for Houston County it is stated that he came to Texas in 1823.

Mr. Pruitt was married to Honor Trenary, daughter of John B. Trenary, a San Jacinto veteran.
