BLAKEY, LBNEL STOCKTON - Born in Barron County, Kentucky, October 6, 1818, a son of Thomas and Nancy Anderson Blakey, who ceme to Texas in January, 1832 from Anderson Ferry, Jackson County, Temnessee with their ten children. The father, who was fifty-seven years of age, died within a few hours after landing at Velasco. Mrs. Blakey was borm October 19, 1782 and died Jenuary 18, 1852 near Bastrop, Texas.

Lemuel S. Blakey was a nember of Captain Jesse Billingsley's company at San Jacinto and was killed in the battle. His heirs on May 19, 1838 were issued Bounty Certificate No. 3461 for 960 acres of Land, May 19, 1838 for Mr. Blakey's services in the army from February 29, to April 21, 1836. They received Donation Certificate No, 136 for 640 acres of land May 21, 1838 due him for having participated in the battle of San Jacinto. In the headright certificate issued to them for one-third of a league of land due Mr. Blakey it was stated that he came to Texas in 1832.

Eamund J. Blakey, brother of Lemuel S. Blakey fought in the battle of Velasco June 26,1832 . He was also a member of Captain Billingsley's company in 1836, but was on furlough to attend to his mother when the battle of San Jacinto was fought. He was killed February 20,1839 while serving with Jacob Burleson against Indians.

Green, Kentucky and was married to Robert Mitchell. Mrs. Mitchell died April 23, 1883.
(2) Mahala T. Blakey was born May 9, 1803. She was married three times. She was first married to John Anderson and after his death was married to Jeptha Boyee. After the death of Mr. Boyce she was married to William Simons. Mrs. Simmons died May 23, 1878.
(3) Sarah A, Blakey was born September 30, 1805 and was married to Robert Anderson, brother of John Anderson. Mrs. Anderson died August 4, 1884.
(4) Thursa N. Blakey was Morn May 8, 1808 and was maxried to Noah Smithwick. Mrs. Smithwick died February 13, 1871. Children of Mr. and Mrs. Suithwick were:

(7) John 罳. Blakey was born December 29, 1815 and died January 15, 1852. His mother died three days later and her remains were placed beside his in the Blakey family cemetery on the Blakey heauright on
a bank of the Colorado River in Bastrop County.
(8) Lemuel S. Blakey was born October 6, 1818, and wes killed at the battle of San Jacinto.
(9) Everett C. Blakey was borm Pebruary 12, 1821 and died in March, 1871. He was married at Bastrop to Lizzie Ship.
(20) Evalina C. Blakey was born October 3, 1824 in Barron County, Kentucky, and died in Bastrop, Texas, December 19, 1862. She was married to WIlliam Hackett Garrett. Their children were (a) Anna Blizabeth, (b) John Spillsberry, (c) Robert Blekey, (d) Naney Anderson, (e) William, (i) Jefferson Davis and (g) Reuben Garrett.
(a) Anna Elizabeth Garrett was married to John Aiken. Their surviving children are John Garrett Aiken, who resides in Gross Plains, Texas, and Herman diken.
(b) John Spilsburry Gerrett was born in Bastrop, April 4, 1848 and died in Nevton, Kansas, August 21, 1871.
(c) Robert Blakey Garrett was born in Bestrop, September 16 , 1848 and was married to Hattie C. Baird at Salado, Texas January 4, 1872. Wrs. Hattie C. Barid Garrett survived her husband and resides at Jayton, Texas. Thelr children are Ita Mitchell Garrett, who married Mlisha Houston Moseley ana after his desth, C. W. Riley and resides at Lamesa; Robert Blakey Garrett. Jr., Lamesa; Leveret P. Garrett Lane, who resides at Jayton; Arthur M. (e) Willian Qarrett was born in Bastrop, September 25, 1856 and was married to Frances Paden in 1882 at Florence, Texas. Died at Clairemont, Texas January 15, 1905. Mrs. Paden resides at Aspermont. Children of Mr. and Mrs. Garrett are Spilsburey Garrett, who resides at 508 k 。17th Street, Cheyenne, Wroming; From Garrett, who married Bailey Bingham and resides at Aspermont; Bruce Garrett who resides at Denver, Colorado.
(f) Jefferson Davis Gerrett was born March 19, 1859 and died in November, 1862.
(g) Reuben Garrett was born December 8, 1862 and died December 27, 1862. After the đeath of his wife, Mr. William Hackett Garrett was married to Leitia A. Barbee.
