Scrap Book, being a part of the records of the Texas Veterans Association, of which Mr. Wheeler was a member, it is shown that Mr. Wheeler was born in New York in about 1800 and came to Texas in 1831. In Headright Certificate No. 411-510, a duplicate of one issued to him September 27, 1838 by the Brazoria County Board of Land Commissioners for one-third of a league of land, it is simply stated that he arrived in Texas prior to May 2, 1835.

Mr. Wheeler was Third Sergeant in Captain Richard Roman's Company at San Jacinto and on May 12, 1846 he was issued Domation Certificate No. 20 for 640 acres of land for having participated in the battle. On October 22, 1857 he received an unnumbered bounty certificate for 320 acres of land for having served in the army from January 29, to April 29, 1836.

Mr. Wheeler died in Fort Bend County in 1880. His grave is lost.
