BURLESON, JONATHAN - Born in Temmessee in 1808 and came to Texas in 1832. He served under Captain Randall Jones. In 1835 he participated in the siege of Bexar. On page 42 of the army rolls in the General Land Office he is shown as a member of Company E, Captain Gibson Kuykendall, who was detailed to guard the camp opposite Harrisburg on April 21, 1836. Apparently he did not apply for a donation certificate. He was issued Bounty Certificate No. 3000 for 320 acres of land, April 23, 1838 for having served in the army from March 1 to May 30, 1836. (Note: Texas 1832 unnumbered H. R. 3/4 L and 1 labor Bastrop)

Mr. Burleson was married to Nancy B. Blakey in 1833. Miss Blakey was a sister of Lemuel S. Blakey, who was killed in the battle of San Jacinto. Mr. Burleson died in Bastrop County, December 3, 1879, while a member of the Texas Veterans Association. He was a member of Hopkinsville (Masonic) Lodge No. 183.
