

MALDONADO, JUAN - Born in San Antonio, Texas. He was a member of Captain Juan N. Seguin's company at San Jacinto and served out his term of enlistment. He re-enlisted in Captain Manuel Flores' company of cavalry, in the regiment commanded by Lieutenant Colonel John N. Seguin, November 5, 1836 and served until May 5, 1837.

~~Seguin~~ Mr. Maldonado apparently did not apply for any of the land he was entitled to receive for his services in the army, but he did receive the wages due him. The following are copied from the Comptroller's Military Service Records in the archives of the Texas State Library.

(Translation)

I certify that Juan Maldonado a soldier of Company B of the regiment of cavalry under my command has served the Republic of Texas from the 5th November to the 5th of May of the present year during which time he has departed himself honorably-- Said Maldonado was in the glorious battle of San Jacinto--Bexar 5th May 1837.

Know all men by these presents that I have this <sup>(day)</sup> authorized constituted and appointed Philip Howard my true and lawful attorney to call on the proper officers and have the annexed Instrument auditted and to take out the treasury draft due me in his own name this August the 31st 1837.
