PARROTT, C. W. - Name omitted from the official San Jacinto rolls printed in 1836. In Comptroller's Military Service Record No. 4428, Captain Robert J. Calder certified that Mr. Parrott served in his company from March 22 to June 20, 1836. He stated he was detailed April 21st as a stewart in the hospital and that his name was unintentionally omitted from the San Jacinto rolls. He was issued Donation Certificate No. 75 for 640 acres of land May 18, 1847 for having participated in the pattle. He received Bounty Certificate No. 269 for 320 acres of land for having served in the army from March 1 to June 1, 1836.

In an unnumbered headright for one-third of a league of land issued to him in 1839 by the Fort Bend County Beard of Land Commissioners it is simply stated that Mr. Parrett came to Texas before March 2, 1836. The certificate was lost and a duplicate was issued. The land was surveyed in Marnes and Wilson Counties in 1840.

Mr. Parrott was a charter member of St. John (Masonic) Lodge No. 5 at Columbia, Brazoria County, May 15, 1838. G. W. PARROTT - No. 4428, 24th Oct. 1837
